



2004 Workforce Profile of Registered Nurses in Canada

Demographic Profile

- In 2004, there were **263,356 registered nurses** (RNs) in Canada, an increase of 3.4% from 2000.
- Of this number of nurses:
 - **93.6%** (246,575) were *employed in nursing*, an increase of 6.0% from 2000 (from 232,566 to 246,575);
 - **1.9%** (4,880) were *employed outside of nursing*;
 - **3.3%** (8,497) were *not employed*; and
 - 1.4% (3,674) did not state their employment status.
- The **ratio of practising registered nurses to the Canadian population** in 2004 was one registered nurse to every 129 persons.¹

- **Males represent 5.4% of RNs** (13,379) employed in nursing, with 43.2% practising in Québec, 26.5% in Ontario, 10.1% in British Columbia, 6.9% in Alberta, 4.2% in Manitoba and 9.1% distributed throughout the remaining provinces/territories.
- **Females represent 94.6% of the RN population** (233,196) employed in nursing

- 51.0%** (125,788) worked **full-time** in 2004 versus 51.7% (120,284) in 2000;
- 32.1%** (79,256) worked **part-time** in 2004 versus 33.2% (77,114) in 2000;
- 10.1%** (24,821) worked on a **casual** basis in 2004 versus 14.8% (34,406) in 2000;
- 6.8%** (14,347) were of **unknown status** (not stated) in 2004 versus 0.3% (762) in 2000.
