

# 2006 WORKFORCE PROFILE

## of Registered Nurses in Canada



### Demographic Profile

- In 2006, there were 270,845 **registered nurses** (RNs) in Canada, an increase of 10.7% from 2001.
- Of this number of nurses:
  - **93.4%** (252,948) were **employed in nursing**, an increase of 9.3% from 231,512 in 2001.
  - **1.8%** (4,776) were **employed outside of nursing**.
  - **3.2%** (8,551) were **not employed**.
  - **1.7%** (4,570) **did not state** their employment status.
- The **ratio of RNs employed in nursing to the Canadian population** in 2006 was one RN for every 129 persons.
- The ratios of **RNs employed in nursing** in 2006 by jurisdiction relative to the jurisdiction population were as follows:

- **Men represent 5.6% of RNs** (14,283) employed in nursing, with 40.9% practising in Quebec, 27.8% in Ontario, 10.4% in British Columbia, 7.2% in Alberta, and the rest distributed throughout the remaining provinces and territories.
- **Women represent 94.4% of RNs** (238,665) employed in nursing.

- Canadian RNs employed in nursing in 2006 and 2001 reported their **employment status** as follows:
  - **55.76%** (141,047) worked **full time** in 2006 versus 53.32% (123,434) in 2001.
  - **32.47%** (82,120) worked **part time** in 2006 versus 33.86% (78,392) in 2001.
  - **10.82%** (27,366) worked on a **casual** basis in 2006 versus 14.94% (34,592) in 2001.
